- 1. The meeting was called to order at 1:34 pm.
- 2. The subcommittee is continuing to explore potential strategies for increasing awareness and diversity participation in WGSD construction projects and will develop a mission statement and strategic objectives for implementing our goals.
- 3. The subcommittee is compiling examples of diversity outreach programs; RFPs and RFQs that include minority business participation requirements; and other examples of contractor bidding requirements that could be considered for use on future WGSD projects.
- 4. Federal, state, and regional programs for diversity participation include a range of requirements, including the following:
 - a. Diverse business certification
 - Certified minority business status (e.g., MBE and WBE) is strictly based on ownership, not employee/workforce diversity.
 - ii. Examples of agencies who offer certification include:
 - 1. U.S. Small Business Administration.
 - 2. Missouri Office of Equal Opportunity.
 - 3. St. Louis Lambert International Airport Business Diversity Development Department (certifying body for the City of St. Louis).
 - 4. 8(a) Business Development Program (federal mentoring program for small, disadvantaged businesses).
 - b. Participation goals
 - i. Typically based on a percentage of the total contract.
 - ii. Federal and state agencies and some municipalities have legislation in place that establishes diversity participation requirements.
 - iii. Some local businesses (e.g., Boeing and BJC HealthCare) have diversity contracting and procurement policies.
 - iv. The Webster Groves School Board cannot specify quotas for bidding based on race but can encourage minority contractor participation.
 - c. Methodology for evaluating bids and validating performance.
 - i. Some bid proposal evaluations include a qualifier point system based on levels of diversity participation.
 - ii. Most contracts require documentation after contract award to track participation levels/subcontracting dollars.
- 5. Next Steps for the subcommittee members:
 - a. Draft a mission statement and strategic objectives for implementing diversity participation goals. Tristen Wiley is leading this effort.
 - b. Continue to compile examples of minority participation policies for regional agencies and school districts for reference. Rob Steuber is leading this effort.
 - c. Schedule a subcommittee meeting for next month.
