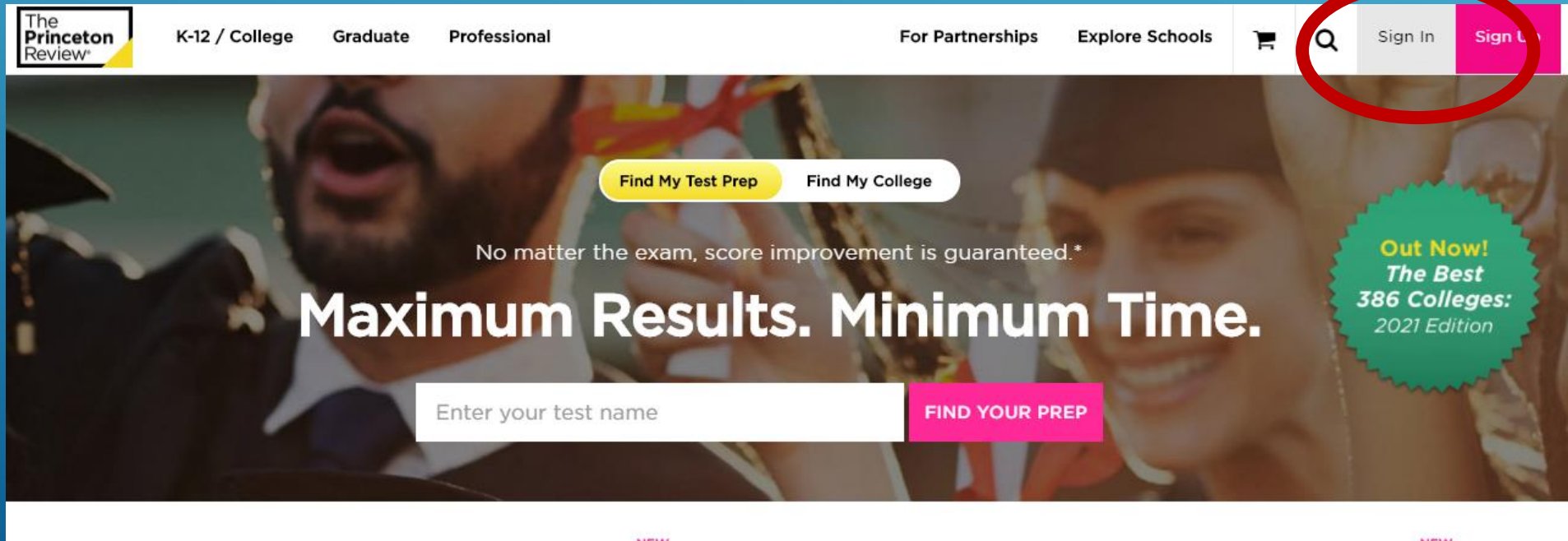


Step 1:

- Select "sign in", upper right corner of your screen





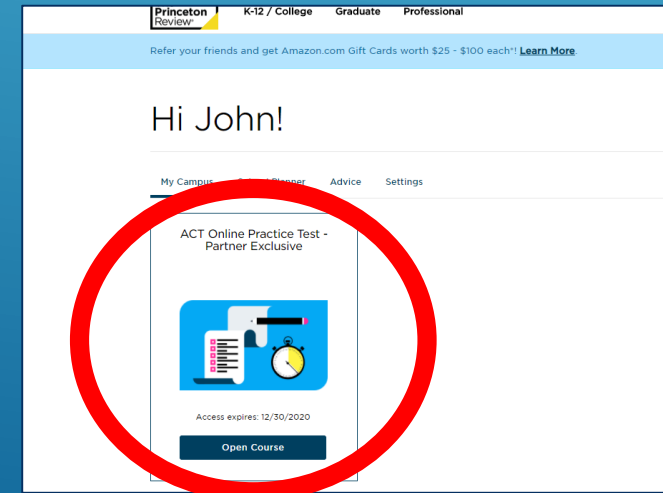
Step 3:


Step 4:

Testing Tips:

- Plan for four and a half hours of uninterrupted testing time
- Make sure you have your calculator handy and it has fresh batteries
- Have extra scratch paper and pencils with you while testing
- Be sure to follow proctoring instructions, only breaking when there is an official break.
- Remember, for the most accurate results, you'll want to replicated the testing environment to the best of your ability! Choose a quiet space, allow enough time for you to take the entire test, and don't forget the essay portion!

Tackling the Essay


Here are some Essay tips to help you achieve your best score:

1. **Read the prompt!** Take some time to read it thoroughly and make sure you understand the essay task.
2. **Brainstorm!** Take a few minutes to think about and plan what you want to write about. Setting up a plan before you start writing will ultimately save you time.
3. **Keep it tidy!** If your graders can't read your essay (or your handwriting), they can't score it. Don't forget to indent your paragraphs, too.
4. **Stay organized!** The 5-paragraph essay is a classic for a reason. Include an intro, 2-3 body paragraphs, and a conclusion.
5. **Proofread!** Make sure to leave 3-5 minutes at the end to proofread your essay. Check for spelling errors and grammar mistakes. While graders are not supposed to deduct points for these errors, mistakes can be distracting.

Step 6:

- Choose your time constraint and begin testing. Remember, this is for practice. It does not benefit you to choose an incorrect time allotment.
