Referral and Selection Process (Grades 2 – 12)

- 1. REFERRAL One referral may be submitted for any student (grades 2-12) in the Webster Groves School District. An online referral is available.
- 2. PARENTAL NOTIFICATION The online Permission to Test form will be emailed to the parent/guardian upon receiving the referral form. It must be completed by the parent/guardian before the evaluation may begin.
- 3. EVALUATION A testing date will be provided to the student's parent/guardian prior to the evaluation taking place. There are four components that are considered when determining a student's eligibility for gifted services:
 - a. A nationally normed general mental ability (IQ) test
 - b. Achievement test scores in Mathematics and Reading (NWEA or WIAT)
 - c. A behavior rating scale completed by the student's teacher(s) (Scales for Rating the Behavioral Characteristics of Superior Students)
 - d. Creativity Assessment (Torrance Tests of Creative Thinking)

4. RESULTS, PARENTAL NOTIFICATION AND PLACEMENT

- a. Gifted services are not warranted for the student based on the evaluation results.
 - i. Test results will be mailed to the parent/guardian.
 - ii. A Review meeting may be held within 30 days of receiving the results and if the minimum general ability score is at the 94th percentile.
- b. Gifted services are warranted for the student based on the evaluation results.
 - i. Test results will be mailed to the parent/guardian.
 - ii. Gifted services will begin for the student.
 - iii. The building gifted specialist will communicate with the parent/guardian more details about the gifted services.

Additional Information

- Students may be referred at any time during the school year.
- If services are warranted in both the *Gifted Fine Arts Program* and the *Academic Gifted and Talented Program*, concurrent participation in both programs will be made on a case by case decision with the school's problem solving team including the parent/guardian.
- Due to COVID county and district guidelines, the Gifted Evaluation Process may change without prior notice.
